Navigating Risk & Leading from the Front

As an anaesthetist, Dr Richard Harris made critical decisions every day, often with lives at stake. His ability to assess and manage risk was pushed to its limit during the Tham Luang Thai Cave Rescue, where he played a key leadership role in the mission to save 12 boys and their soccer coach trapped in a flooded cave system. In that extraordinary situation, he had to weigh not only the risks to those trapped, but also the safety of his team and himself.

In this session, Richard will share powerful insights from that experience and explore broader themes of leadership and risk. He will also draw on his research and interviews with renowned risk-takers, including climber Alex Honnold (from Free Solo), sailor Jessica Watson, and filmmaker and deep-sea explorer James Cameron, offering a unique perspective on how we understand and manage risk in high-pressure situations.

Don't Risk Burnout. Personal & Team Wellbeing and Culture

Justine Flynn is the Co-Founder of Thankyou, a social enterprise that brings consumers a product choice that exists for one purpose only; to help create a world where not one person lives in extreme poverty. Thankyou has raised over \$18.5 million towards the end of extreme poverty.

In this session, Justine will share her journey of leading a team to build one of the world's leading brands and the immense pressures that come with it. She will discuss the delicate balance between leadership and burnout, a challenge well-known to independent school leaders. Having experienced severe burnout herself, resulting in being bedridden for four months, Justine will offer insights on leadership and self-care to help you and your team avoid burnout.






