Richard had to consider not only the lives of those trapped but also his own and his team's safety.
		Richard will share his experiences in leadership and risk management, as well as his research into risk, through interviews with renowned risk-takers such as climber Alex Honnold (from the movie <i>Free Solo</i>), sailor Jessica Watson, and film director and deep-sea diver James Cameron.
