Shows how many students attend schools located in this Queensland electorate.

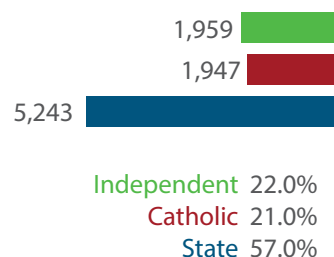

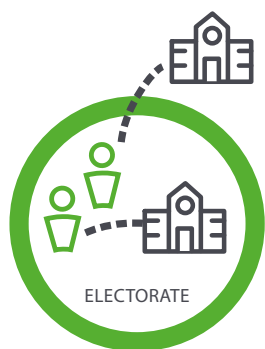

**Total Students, by Sector, Attending Schools Located in this Electorate**



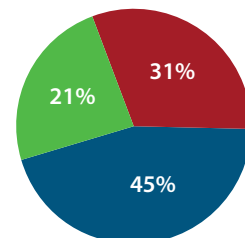
### STUDENT PARTICIPATION RATES<sup>2</sup>
